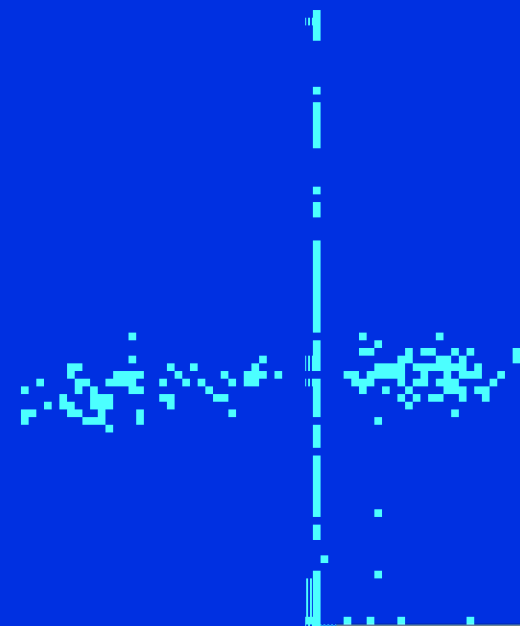

The Curriculum Review Committee of the Faculty Senate has approved the following:

ADDITIONS

The following courses have been approved for addition to the curriculum:

1. **ENGL 101** - Introduction to English Literature (3 credits)
This course is designed to provide students with a broad overview of English literature from the Middle Ages to the present. It will cover major authors and works, as well as critical theory and methods of literary analysis.

2. **ENGL 201** - Advanced English Literature (3 credits)
This course is designed to provide students with a more in-depth study of English literature. It will focus on a specific period or genre, and will include close reading and critical analysis of primary texts.

3. **ENGL 301** - English Literature in Context (3 credits)
This course is designed to provide students with a historical and cultural context for English literature. It will explore the relationship between literature and society, and will include a study of the social and political conditions that influenced the development of the English literary tradition.

4. **ENGL 401** - English Literature in Translation (3 credits)
This course is designed to provide students with a study of English literature in translation. It will focus on the challenges of translating literary texts, and will include a study of the ways in which translation can affect the meaning and interpretation of a work.

5. **ENGL 501** - English Literature in the Digital Age (3 credits)
This course is designed to provide students with a study of English literature in the digital age. It will explore the ways in which digital technology has changed the way we read and interpret literary texts, and will include a study of the challenges and opportunities of digital literacy.

6. **ENGL 601** - English Literature in the Global Context (3 credits)
This course is designed to provide students with a study of English literature in the global context. It will explore the ways in which English literature has been influenced by and has influenced other cultures, and will include a study of the challenges and opportunities of global literacy.

7. **ENGL 701** - English Literature in the Postcolonial Context (3 credits)
This course is designed to provide students with a study of English literature in the postcolonial context. It will explore the ways in which English literature has been influenced by and has influenced postcolonial cultures, and will include a study of the challenges and opportunities of postcolonial literacy.

8. **ENGL 801** - English Literature in the Contemporary Context (3 credits)
This course is designed to provide students with a study of English literature in the contemporary context. It will explore the ways in which English literature has been influenced by and has influenced contemporary culture, and will include a study of the challenges and opportunities of contemporary literacy.

9. **ENGL 901** - English Literature in the Future Context (3 credits)
This course is designed to provide students with a study of English literature in the future context. It will explore the ways in which English literature has been influenced by and has influenced the future, and will include a study of the challenges and opportunities of future literacy.

10. **ENGL 1001** - English Literature in the 21st Century (3 credits)
This course is designed to provide students with a study of English literature in the 21st century. It will explore the ways in which English literature has been influenced by and has influenced the 21st century, and will include a study of the challenges and opportunities of 21st-century literacy.

11. **ENGL 1101** - English Literature in the 22nd Century (3 credits)
This course is designed to provide students with a study of English literature in the 22nd century. It will explore the ways in which English literature has been influenced by and has influenced the 22nd century, and will include a study of the challenges and opportunities of 22nd-century literacy.

12. **ENGL 1201** - English Literature in the 23rd Century (3 credits)
This course is designed to provide students with a study of English literature in the 23rd century. It will explore the ways in which English literature has been influenced by and has influenced the 23rd century, and will include a study of the challenges and opportunities of 23rd-century literacy.
